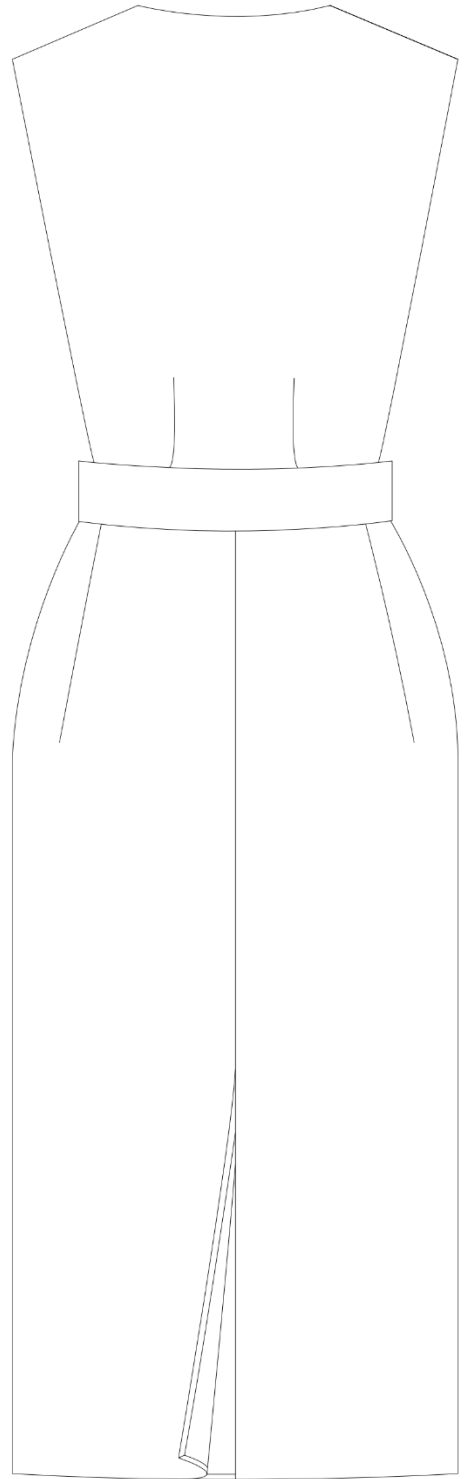
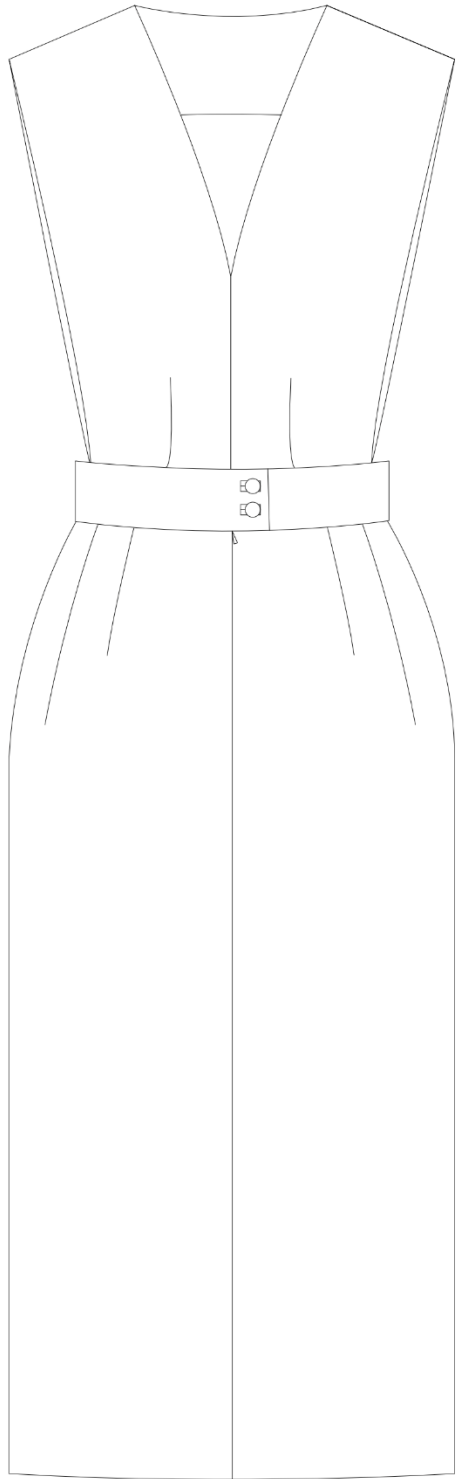


Sewing instructions Begonia pinafore dress







If you have a serger you can use it finish all the edges before sewing, otherwise it is possible to use biasbinding to finish the edges or turn them around and sew them by hand.







### Top part of the dress

<p>Step 1</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Sew pleads</li></ul>	
<p>Step 2</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Sew shoulder seam</li></ul>	
<p>Step 3</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Sew front lining on front panels</li></ul>	
<p>Step 4</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- sew armhole lining</li></ul>	
<p>Step 5</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- sew neck lining and iron</li></ul>	
<p>Step 6</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- if no serger or binding, finish seams by hand (folding 1cm back and handstitching to the other layer of fabric)</li></ul>	



### Bottom

<p>Step 1</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- sew figure lines</li> </ul>	
<p>Step 2</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- sew front panels together till zipper</li> </ul>	
<p>Step 3</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- sew back panels together till slit</li> </ul>	
<p>Step 4</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- it is possible to insert the invisible zipper at this point (can also be done at a later point)</li> </ul>	
<p>Step 5</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- sew side panels together</li> </ul>	
<p>Step 6</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- if no serger or binding, finish seams by hand (folding 1cm back and handstitching to the other layer of fabric)</li> </ul>	

## Waist band + Button hole

<p>Step 1</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- draw all the lines needed for the button hole</li> </ul>	
<p>Step 2</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- pin or handsew the 2 flaps in their place and sew them with the machine on the line drawn</li> </ul>	
<p>Step 3</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- cut in the fabric, like the picture shows</li> <li>- turn inside out</li> </ul>	
<p>Step 4</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- when turned inside out sew the flaps on the front shut together with some nice surgical stitches</li> </ul>	
<p>Step 5</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- flip part of the fabric on the short side and stitch the little triangle shut to the flaps</li> </ul>	
<p>Step 6</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- iron/steam/press everything flat</li> <li>- remove the surgical stitches</li> </ul>	

## Finishing the dress

<p>Step 1</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- hand sew the top and the bottom part together, can be done by machine or with handstitches</li> </ul>	
<p>Step 2</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- check the waistband is horizontal</li> </ul>	
<p>Step 3</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- pin the outer waistband onto the dress</li> </ul>	
<p>Step 4</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- if you haven't insert the invisible zipper yet, now is your time</li> <li>-</li> </ul>	
<p>Step 5</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- if the waistband is in the correct place, handsew the inside in place as well</li> </ul>	
<p>Step 6</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- top stitch the waistband</li> </ul>	
<p>Step 7</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- sew the hemline</li> </ul> <p>*Warning, due to both front and back panels being the same size it is preferable to fit the dress and see if the hem is horizontal. If not pin the length needed (back is most likely to be shorter), press and sew in place</p>
